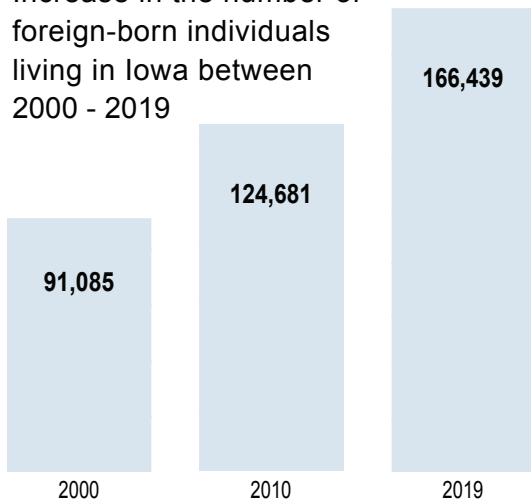

Countries listed by region where at least 500 persons are from that region

- 59,883 North/Central America:** Includes Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean (Cuba and Haiti), El Salvador, Guatemala and Honduras
- 24,280 Southeast Asia:** Includes Myanmar (Burma), Cambodia, Laos, Malaysia, Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam
- 17,513 East Asia:** Includes China, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Japan and South Korea
- 14,546 South Central Asia:** Includes Afghanistan, Bangladesh, India, Iran, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka
- 4,156 Western Asia:** Includes Iraq, Lebanon and Saudi Arabia
- 21,609 Africa:** Includes Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia, Republic of Congo, Egypt, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Sudan and Liberia
- 19,147 Europe:** Includes UK, Germany, Netherlands, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Russia and Ukraine
- 3,676 South America:** Includes Brazil and Colombia
- 1,487 Oceania:** Includes Federated States of Micronesia (including Chuuk and Pohnpei) and the Republic of the Marshall Islands
